April 1913– Ethel let Emmeline Pankhurst (who was famous in the local Suffrage Movement) stay at her cottage while she was hiding from police. Name: Millicent Fawcett

Born: 11th June 1847

Key Events:

1897—Millicent formed the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies (NUWSS) which came before the



more militant WSPU led by the Pankhurst family.

2017—Millicent Fawcett announced as first woman statue in Parliament Square.

Name: Emily Wilding Davison

Born: 11th October 1872

Key Events:

1891– Emily won a bursary to Royal Holloway College to study literature.



1906- Joined WSPU.

4 June 1913– Emily was hit by the King George V's horse at Epsom derby. She later died from her injuries.

Suffragists were fighting for the same things but did it in a much more peaceful way.

What does WSPU and NUWSS mean?

NUWSS stands for the National Union for Women's Suffrage Societies which was set up in 1897 and campaigned for women's rights in peaceful way. Many suffragists belonged to this group.

WSPU stands for the Women's Social and Political Union which was set up in 1903. Their motto was Deeds Not Words. Most Suffragists belonged to this group.
